For 46 years, Dismas House of Nashville has served as a beacon of hope for formally incarcerated men desperately looking for a second chance. To date, we have served more than 1,000 men from our current location on Music Row. However, we could only serve 20 residents a year in our eight bed home despite receiving more than 300 applications annually. We wanted to have a greater impact in our community by helping more men.

In a few weeks, we will be able to serve up to 200 men when the doors of our new campus open at **2424 Charlotte Avenue**. In celebration of this milestone in our organization's history, we are commemorating this moment with a weeklong celebration. We welcome you to join us for **Dismas House Week**, April 7th – 9th.
