Dismas House Wins Two Urban Land Institute Awards





On April 26, Dismas House was recognized by Urban Land Institute (ULI) Nashville with two Excellence in Development Awards. ULI is the oldest and largest network of cross-disciplinary real estate and land use experts in the world. ULI Nashville's Excellence in Development Awards celebrate developments that are exceptional in building and site design and that positively impact Middle Tennessee.

Of the 18 organizations nominated for the 13th annual ceremony, Dismas House received one of eight final recognitions for projects that demonstrate outstanding, purpose-driven architecture. Additionally, ULI honored Dismas House with a second accolade: the Rose Faeges-Easton Community Impact Award. The inaugural award celebrates the Founding Director of ULI Nashville and commends the impact of projects that address significant needs while modeling public/private partnerships.

Outside of his current role as National Advocacy and Campaigns Director at Fines & Fees Justice Center, Louis is an award-winning author, commentator for the Law & Crime Network, licensed and board-certified addictions practitioner, and producer of Hulu's *UnPrisoned* series.

Resident Spotlight

Terry joined Dismas House in December 2021 and quickly began working toward a variety of personal ambitions. Known for his self-discipline, he understands that success comes with hard work. For Terry, it's not a matter of if but when he'll reach his goals. "Dismas House provides the structure that men coming out of prison

need to succeed. We have all the freedom to make our own choices but also the resources needed to make the best choices."

In 18 months, Terry improved his credit score by over 225 points and dramatically increased his savings. Ultimately, these ladder up to his primary goals of owning a home and opening a transitional facility. Guided by his own experience, Terry hopes to change the way justice-involved individuals view recovery and healing.

"It's important to know that we don't have to let things stay the way they were," Terry stated. "I've started a new life, and I appreciate the opportunity to be seen as who I am now. When I walk into a room, I'm just Terry. I'm not defined by anything I've done."
