### **2023 VOLUNTEER APPRECIATION WEEK**



During the week of Feb. 20 to Feb. 24, we held our annual Volunteer Appreciation Week presented by Vanderbilt University. We gathered on our campus with family, friends, and colleagues to honor those who generously offer their time and talent to make Dismas House a better place. Congratulations to all of the 2023 honorees.

**Community Partner Service Award** – 2023 Recipient: Shade Tree Clinic, a student-run clinic that provides free, high-quality care to uninsured and underinsured individuals in the Nashville area.

**Student Service Award** - 2023 Recipient: Declan Harris, a Dismas House clinical intern who provides individual support to residents, facilitates groups, and continues to think of new ways to best serve the men at Dismas House.

**Volunteer Service Recognition Award** - 2023 Recipient: Patchwork, a group of chefs who are an integral part of providing dinners and weekend meals for Dismas House residents.

**John Jenkins, Jr. Resident Service Award** - 2023 Recipient: Michael Barrett, who is our first Individual Placement and Support participant and was chosen to speak at an event with Governor Lee in November 2022. He is employed as a chef at our employment partner, and he is currently pursuing a two-year Culinary Arts A.A.S. degree.

**Board Service Recognition Award** - 2023 Recipient: Steve Cook, whose expertise, advice and counsel have been invaluable to Dismas House as he serves on the Executive Committee and leads as the Board Chair.

**Grace Morales Outstanding Service Award** - 2023 Recipient: Phil Ryan is a member of the Board and serves on the Capital Campaign Committee. He was instrumental in connecting us to resources during our expansion project.

#### **2023 DAY ON THE HILL**

On January 26, we hosted our annual Day on the Hill breakfast at the capitol in Nashville. Residents and staff members had discussions with state legislators about how they can contribute to the efforts of supporting citizens who are reentering society. Dismas House is an approved Tennessee Department of Correction (TDOC) residential reentry program, and we receive funding from the State. It's our goal to make sure our legislators know the value of our services. People who come through our program have a significantly lower recidivism rate, which saves taxpayer dollars.

"I'm hoping to have more meetings with senators and representatives to help them see what a new reentry model looks like," Dismas House CEO Kay Kretsch said. "I also bring the residents here so they will know this is the people's house and they are as welcome here as I am."







#### **APRIL IS NATIONAL SECOND CHANCE MONTH**



Since 2014, April has been observed in the United States as Second Chance Month. The initiative was established to recognize the importance of reentry and the role each member of the community plays in supporting safe and successful reentry. From the U.S. Department of Justice

to the Tennessee Office of Reentry (OOR), organizations across the country will celebrate throughout the month with live events, webinars, podcasts and other learning opportunities. With nearly 95 percent of incarcerated Americans being released at some point, it's important that adequate resources are dedicated to the reentry population, and awareness is raised in the entire community.
